The benefits of this upgrade include the following: Improved detail analysis, automatic data preparation features (especially with Excel), improved server performance, and a more intuitive and streamlined Tableau Server Environment.

We will continue to provide consultations on the workbooks that you have created as well as additional training opportunities. We hope that you will take advantage of these and increase your Tableau knowledge.

## What have we done?

We stood up the Tableau Shared Server Environment to allow us to on-board clients interested in publishing their Tableau workbooks for use. The Office of Development, Presidents Office, Public Safety, and Procurement have deployed Tableau workbooks to our Production environment. We held client assessments to begin the on-boarding process and provided Tableau consultation sessions to a variety of clients with different business use cases.
